In adults, the diagnosis of obesity is most commonly made using BMI levels. BMI is calculated as weight in kilograms (kg) divided by height in metres squared (m 2). Ideal BMI is 18.5 to 24.9 kg/m 2. The following classification is advised by NICE: A BMI of 25-29.9 kg/m 2 is overweight. A BMI of 30-34.9 kg/m 2 is obese (Grade I).

In 2016, 39% of adults aged 18 years and over (39% of men and 40% of women) were overweight. Overall, about 13% of the world's adult population (11% of men and 15% of women) were obese in 2016. The worldwide prevalence of obesity nearly tripled between 1975 and 2016.

For most adults, a BMI of: 18.5 to 24.9 means you're a healthy weight; 25 to 29.9 means you're overweight; 30 to 39.9 means you're obese; 40 or above means you're severely obese; BMI isn't used to definitively diagnose obesity because people who are very muscular sometimes have a high BMI without excess fat.

West Virginia has the highest adult obesity rate at 38.1% and Colorado has the lowest at 22.6%. The adult obesity rate increased in Iowa, Massachusetts, Ohio, Oklahoma, Rhode Island and South Carolina between 2016 and 2017, and remained stable in the rest of states.
